### Special Prizes

The Sandy Cumming Memorial Trophy, sponsored by RBST Caledonian, will be awarded to the best bird from a breed listed on the RBST Poultry Breeds at Risk Register

Other perpetual prizes, trophies and any special prizes relating to a specific class are detailed with that class.

## Rules:

1. All classes are held under the general rules and conditions of the Festival, including Covid restrictions.
2. All birds entered in the Festival's show must be the bone fide property of the exhibitor at the closing date for entries to the show.
3. No bird may compete in more than one class unless specifically stated in the class description and a bird may only be exhibited in the class appropriate to it. Please ensure that the entry form is completed accurately as no refund of entry fees will be made in respect of a bird entered in a class for which it is not eligible.
4. Birds suffering from any form of contagious or infectious disease must not be brought to the Festival.
5. Entry forms must be completed in full and must be received, with full payment of entry fees, by the Secretary no later than Friday 1<sup>st</sup> October 2021. No late entries will be accepted.
6. Egg classes are included in the Garden, Craft and Food competition; the schedule is available to download from [www.ssgf.uk](http://www.ssgf.uk).
7. Substitution of entries will not be permitted after the closing date for entries and no refund will be made in respect of withdrawals made after that date.
8. In the event of there being more birds entered than can be accommodated, the organisers reserve the right to require exhibitors to make a proportionate reduction in the number of entries. A refund of appropriate entry fees will be made in these circumstances.
9. In the event of any class having fewer than three entries on the day, the organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes. This will be at the discretion of the Steward, after discussion with the Judge.
10. While within the Festival venue, all exhibits are subject to the orders of the Steward and may not be withdrawn from competition without his / her consent.
11. The Steward will allocate pen numbers on the day.
12. Exhibitors and other persons in charge of poultry must not display the name of the exhibitor in any way during judging.
13. Birds must be in their allocated pens by 8.45am. No access will be allowed after this deadline.
14. No birds may be shown with open rings
15. After penning, birds may not be handled by any person without the permission of the Steward.
16. Only sawdust provided by the organisers may be used in cages
17. Birds must be provided with adequate food and water at all times. Water and water containers will be available at the venue but exhibitors must provide food.
18. Judging will commence at 9.30am. The class order will as per the Schedule.

19. With the exception of the Stewards or other representatives of the Organiser, no person will be admitted to the judging area during the judging.
20. The Judge may disqualify any exhibit fraudulently dealt with or any person he deems guilty of dishonorable conduct.
21. Exhibitors may uplift their birds after 4pm or immediately after all judging is completed, whichever is the later, unless permission to leave early has been given by the Steward.
22. Any protests must be lodged with the Organiser in writing, before 3pm on the day of the Festival. The Organiser reserves the right to settle all protests or disputes that may arise and that decision is final.
23. Prize money, where payable, must be collected from the Steward at the completion of the judging. No prizes will be posted out after the event.
24. The presentation of trophies and special prizes will take place at 1.30pm in the Poultry Pen Area. All section winners, winners of trophies and the Champion and Reserve Champion are expected to attend. Photographs will be taken.
25. Where prizes or donations have been made for any particular class or purpose, such prize or donation will be awarded to that class or purpose for which it was given.

The winners of classes 201 – 204 will compete for **Best Utility Fowl**, with the winner progressing to compete for the Championship.

The winner of Class 204 will receive a special prize of £10, donated by BHWT.

### Section C Young Poultry Keepers (Under 16 years of age at the date of the Festival)

**Special Prize:** The Best Junior will win the Scottish Smallholder Festival Perpetual Shield
