2023 marks the 50th Anniversary of the founding of the Rare Breed Survival Trust. It also marks the establishment of RBST Scotland.

To celebrate both events, Smallholding Scotland is delighted to work with RBST to host the RBST 50th Anniversary Championships at the Scottish Smallholder Festival 2023.

Each show at the Festival – sheep, goats and pigs – will generate its own Rare Breed Champion and these three animals will go head to head to compete to be the RBST 50th Anniversary Grand Champion.

The Rare Breed Champion for each species will receive prize money of £25 and a special rosette.

The Grand Champion will receive prize money of £75, a trophy and a rosette.

The Reserve Champion will receive prize money of £50 and a rosette.

Entry fees

For pigs entered in classes 1-28, £10 for the first pig and £5 per pig thereafter.

There is no entry fee for classes in Section D Special Classes, but pigs entered in handling classes 30 and 31 must have been shown in classes Sections A-C.

Entry fees are only refundable in the event of the Festival being cancelled for reasons within the Organiser's control.

Class Prizes

For classes 1- 28:

Special Prizes

Other perpetual prizes, trophies and any special prizes relating to a specific class are detailed with that class.

Rules:

1. All classes are held under the general rules and conditions recommended by the British Pig Association and under the general rules and conditions of the Festival as detailed below.
2. All pigs entered in the Festival's show must be the bone fide property of the exhibitor and must have been in their ownership since 1st September 2023, unless otherwise stated.
3. No animal may compete in more than one class unless specifically stated in the class descriptor.
4. All pigs in Sections A-C must be registered with the BPA, British Lop or BKKPS society.
5. Boars of two years of age or over must be certified as having sired at least two live litters within the twelve months before the closing date for entries. The pigs comprising such litters must have been birth notified in the BPA Herd Book or proof of their birth must have been given to the BPA or equivalent society.
6. The use of artificial colouring, whitening and / or powder on pigs as well as the removal or addition of spots by artificial means is prohibited. The use of white wood flour is permitted.
7. Animals suffering from any form of contagious or infectious disease must not be brought to the Festival.
8. No animal may be exhibited that is in the final stage of gestation (within 2 weeks of the estimated due date) or within three weeks after giving birth.
9. **Entry forms must be completed in full and must be received by the Secretary no later than Saturday 1st October.**
10. In the event of any class having fewer than three entries on the day, the Organiser reserves the right to amalgamate classes. This will be at the discretion of the Steward, following discussion with the Judge.
11. In the event of any breed in sections A or C having more than five representatives from two or more exhibitors, the Steward may, following discussion with the Judge, convene a separate class for that breed.
12. Pigs must be in their allocated pens by 9am. There will be no access after this time.
13. Exhibitors are responsible for the correct completion and submission of movement licenses to the appropriate government agencies. All pigs must be correctly tagged or tattooed in accordance with current legislation. **All exhibitors must bring a printed copy of the movement notification to the Festival and give it to the Steward prior to unloading the pigs.**
14. A competent person must be in attendance on each lot of pigs for the duration of the Festival and all attendants must comply with reasonable requests from the Steward.

15. Handlers are required to be of smart appearance: white coats must be worn at all times in the show ring. Proper pig boards and sticks must be used.
16. Two competent adult handlers, carrying protective boards, must show all boars.
17. All boars over 12 months of age must have their tusks cut prior to the event.
18. Judging will commence at 10:00 am. The class order will be as per the Schedule.
19. With the exception of the Stewards or other representatives of the Organiser, no person will be admitted to the judging rings or permitted to be in contact with the judges on any pretext.
20. Exhibitors may uplift their pigs after 4pm or immediately after all the judging is completed, whichever is the later unless permission to leave early has been granted by the Steward.
21. Any protests must be lodged with the Organiser in writing, before 3pm on the day of the Festival. The Organiser reserves the right to settle all protests or disputes that may arise and that decision is final.
22. Prize money, where payable, will be attached to prize cards and distributed with rosettes by the Judge or Steward at the end of each class.
23. Where prizes or donations have been made for any particular class or purpose, such prize or donation will be awarded to that class or purpose for which it was given.
24. Exhibitors will be provided with straw bedding for their animals from the Festival organiser. Sawdust will also be made available to exhibitors.

Section A British Rare and Traditional Breeds

Breeds that are, or have been on the RBST Watchlist: Berkshire, British Lop, British Saddleback, Gloucestershire Old Spot, Large Black, Landrace, Large White (BPA Registered), Middle White, Oxford Sandy and Black, Tamworth, Welsh.

Pig Agility - Open to all exhibitors and general public
